2023 ANNUAL REPORT

1. REPORTING PERIOD

This report covers the period 1 December 2022– 10 September 2023. The report gives a detailed description of the SANORD Central Office's (SCO) activities in terms of its office operations, Secretariat function, Research Working Group, and the vital input from our Contact Persons at each member institution in the SANORD network.

2. GOVERNANCE

2.1 The Council

The Council is the total membership in SANORD and comprises a well-represented cohort of 33 Southern African and 24 Nordic member institutions. The Central office and its members' invaluable willingness and efforts direct the organisation. Members volunteer their time to serve on various committees to support the Central Office in achieving SANORD's focused goals.

The Council elects a Vice Chairperson bi-annually on a rotation basis for a two-year term. Articles of our Statutes refer to the Vice Chancellor/Principals or their respective proxies as representatives as Council members of SANORD. The Council members have been instrumental in developing policy and strategies related to the Central office and its activities, as well as to innovative initiatives for SANORD research, collaboration, and programme of development.

The SANORD Council gathers once a year in conjunction with our annual conference. The 2022 Council meeting took place at the Ranch in Limpopo at the SANORD Annual Conference.

2.2 Executive members

SANORD Chairperson

Per the SANORD Statute, Art. V, 4; the clause requires the rotation of the Chairperson between the Southern African and Nordic regions applicable. It meant that the current Vice-Chairperson, Durban University of Technology (DUT) automatically becomes the new Chairperson for the period 1 January 2023-31 December 2024.

• Chair: Durban University of Technology, represented by: Dr. Lavern Samuels

According to the SANORD Statute, **Art, V, 4** the SANORD Council elects a new Vice-chairperson biannually. At the Council meeting on 6 December 2022, the Council announced the proposal for the election of the new Vice-chair for the period 1 January 2023 – 31 December 2023. The duties of the Nominations committee include:

- ii. Assisting in the development of guidelines for:

 - Theme group projects research seed funding calls,
 - Brian O'Connell scholarship criteria and call
 - Student Intern's criteria and call for application.
- **iii.** Evaluating and making recommendations to the Board concerning applications for Theme Group Projects funding support in collaboration with the Research Working Group, and the Brian O' Connell Scholarship applications.
- iv. Coordinating the Council and Board elections and preparing recommendations to the Council
- v. Undertaking any other task as deemed needed by the Board.

2.5 Contact Persons (CPs)

Each member institution appoints a Contact Person who is the communication link between the SANORD Central Office (SCO) and the member institution. CPs play a pivotal role in circulating information through the member institutions' communication channels. They are the key channels and instrumental in keeping their institutions up to date with all the latest news, announcements, and relevant matters of SANORD. CPs meet at least three a year to discuss matters of interest and to keep in touch with the activities in the network. CPs are also valuable in tracking colleagues from neighbouring institutions where necessary.

3. Membership

Since 2022 to date, the membership has increased to 33 members in the Southern African region across the following seven countries such as (Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia, and Zimbabwe) and 24 in the Nordic region across 5 Countries such as (Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden) This brought the total of membership in SANORD at fifty-seven (57) members

3.1 Membership Fees:

SANORD, being a non-profitable organization, is dependent on the payment of membership fees by the members.

Since 2019, the membership fees were fixed until further notice at:

- > R30 000 for Southern African members
- ➤ EUR 4500 for Nordic members

Members are levied to pay their membership fees by the end of March each year to ensure that full membership remains active. At most 80% of the members honour their membership fee payments while 20% of the members do not.

4. SANORD Central Office (SCO)

The SCO is supported by Kelly Cyster and Nicole Umwizerwa and has successfully delivered on all the goals and objectives for this year. SANORD remains a network of committed socially conscious institutions that focus on the public good in its vision and mission. The SCO remains committed to supporting the delivery of this endeavour.

The following operational activities illustrate the major activities that the SCO were actively involved with from January 2023-10 September 2023; supported by the Nominations Committee, Conference committee members and the Contact Person at each institution.

4.1 Webinars: SANORD hosted two webinars thus far to encourage scholarly engagement

Trends in Internationalisation: A Critical Perspective from the South (30 May 2023)

The webinar was hosted by Mr. Umesh Bawa. Internationalisation remains an important element of higher education collaboration. It is motivated by a variety of political, economic, sociocultural, and intellectual factors. It has transformed from a minor activity to a crucial component of the transformation agenda. There was very good participation and engagement around academic freedom and scholarly autonomy, despite the numerous technological challenges. It is hoped that this topic be discussed at SANORD 2023 if there is space on the programme.

SANORD 3MT- Webinar Series 2023 (20 July 2023)

The webinar was hosted by SANORD and facilitated by colleagues from Rhodes University: Centre for Postgraduate Studies, Prof Sioux McKenna and Ms Asiphe Mxalisa. The webinar was focused on various aspects of 3MT.

Several partners visited the SCO and networking across the SANORD strategic goals was successful.

4.2 Brian O'Connell (BOC) Scholarship Programme

In 2022 only two applications were received for the BOC scholarship from Lorensha Naidoo MSc student at Stellenbosch University and Thandwayo Mbambo a master's student at the University of KwaZulu Natal.

The 2023 BOC call was opened and has subsequently closed with 6 applications received for 2023. The Nominations Committee will deliberate and give feedback to the applicants in mid-December 2023.

4.2.2 Brian O'Connell Scholarship (BOC) 2023

The BOC call for 2022 was postponed, due to the previous recipients not being able to take up the scholarship due to a lack of mobility due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Current research projects and BOC scholarship awardees (from our 2022 grants) have received their funding.

4.2.3 Conference Delegate Support (CDS) 2023

SANORD Central Office opened up applications for conference delegation support for individuals' students and staff who have abstracts accepted for the conference.

43 delegates were successful in their application, in addition, 5 Three Minutes thesis candidates also received support in terms of conference delegate support. The CDS only covered conference registration fees and accommodation in Hamar. Due to the high exchange rate the Director had requested an increase in the amount made available for the CDS and his request was approved. A budget of 1 million (ZAR) was approved for the CDS, this also served to ensure a balanced participation from the Southern Africa and Nordic region.

SANORD sponsored 48 delegates from South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia, Mozambique and Zimbabwe for the 2023 Conference in Hamar, Norway. A CDS budget of 600,000 NOK was used to support all those who applied for funding with the approval of the Executive Board. The budget was allocated as follows:

4.2.4 SANORD DAY 19 April 2023

4.2.5 SANORD and One Ocean expedition

SANORD members in and around Cape Town were invited to join the One Ocean expedition on 17 January for SANORD regional meeting and symbolic handover of the SANORD Chair on the magnificent ship. This was a joint event with the University of Bergen. The magnificent ship played host to the event-and the captain and other partners from Norway were very complimentary of the focus. Special thanks to Board member Dr Setsipane Modukwe who travelled from Pretoria down to Cape to support and represent the Board.

Mr Bawa (on behalf of SANORD) was invited to an interview with Cape Talk Radio to speak on the involvement of SANORD in the One Ocean expedition. Erlend Eidsvik joined the interview from the airport where he was about to board his flight from Cape Town to Bergen, after a lovely engagement with the young learners involved in the project. They will journey with him to Bergen to welcome the ship when it returns.

4.2.6 SANORD ONE OCEAN Beach Clean-up

The SANORD Beach Clean-up in association with the University of the Western Cape, The Norwegian embassy, and Western Norway University of Applied Sciences (HVL) took place on 14 January in honour of the work and research being done on the tall ship, Stadsraad Lehmkuhl. The venue for the beach clean was Black River Park which is a highly polluted area as tons of plastic and waste wash up on these shores. It was good for the community to support the One Ocean activity. Thanks to Gro Anita Flaten and Elin Kvaale among others who supported the activity in person.

4.4 SANORD information sessions

SANORD central office, Kelly Cyster and Nicole Umwizerwa presented an information session at the International Education Association of South Africa conference in Durban from 22 August – 25 August 2023. The International Education Association of South Africa (IEASA), a non-profit organisation, was established as a result of the need for universities and universities of technology in South Africa to respond to international educational trends. SANORD member institutions representatives who were at the conference joined the session and provided valuable feedback for SANORD.

On 12 September 2023, SANORD was invited to present an information session at Nelson Mandela University during their research week for Early Career Researchers.

5. Publications

At the Council meeting on 17 August 2018, the Council accepted and duly agreed with the recommendations from the Contact Persons meeting not to continue printing hard copies, however, to go digital with e-publications and publish in reputable journals.

The reasons were based on the financial benefit and accessibility for students in a digital academic world, exposure and prominence for SANORD and the entire network of institutions. The digital book would also ensure that SANORD interacts more freely with all committees and affected parties.

The University of Bergen and Western Norway University of Applied Sciences have published a digital copy of the 2021 SANORD Conference abstract book which can be found on the SANORD website.

The SANORD 2022 Conference host is required to publish an abstract Booklet for the 2022 SANORD Conference.

6. Academic Events:

6.1 SANORD 2023 Conference at INN, Hamar, Norway

The 15th SANORD International conference was hosted by INN Hamar, Norway.

The topic for this year's conference is "The role of higher education in contributing to just and sustainable futures." The world is facing several immense crises, and as part of our mission at INN University, we seek to contribute to solving some of these. We have excellent research communities working on topics such as education, health, natural resource management, agriculture and biotechnology, among others.

A changing world with increasing insecurity requires new solutions in many fields. In Hamar and the Inland region, we are actively taking part in the green shift, and our educational programmes and research reflect this need.

The theme of the conference is the role of higher education in contributing to a just and sustainable future.
